

The RAMSA Fellowship is a \$15,000 prize awarded annually by Robert A.M. Stern Architects for travel and research. The fellowship promotes investigations into the perpetuation of tradition through invention—key to the firm's own work—and is given to an individual who has proven insight and interest in the profession and its future, as well as the ability to carry forth in-depth research.

Fellows travel in the summer and present their research to RAMSA staff the following spring. The fellowship includes an optional residency program with an additional stipend to fund a two-week-long residency at RAMSA's office in New York City before or after the fellowship travel. During the residency, fellows develop their research project with the support of RAMSA staff and resources.

Eligibility

The RAMSA Fellowship is open to graduate students in the penultimate year of a degree program in architecture or a related discipline at a NAAB-accredited school. This includes students in interior design, historic preservation, landscape architecture, urban design, and other programs. PhD students are not eligible. There is no limit to the number of students who may apply from each school.

Jury

A jury of three RAMSA partners selects a winner and a finalist based on the clarity, feasibility, and originality of the proposals. All applications remain anonymous to the jury throughout the selection process.

Through essays, maps, photographs, and drawings, the fellows present their trips to Austria, India, Italy, Japan, Kenya, Scotland, Slovenia, and the United States. Recent recipients have traveled to China, Egypt, Italy, and Morocco, where they have studied a wide range of topics from the construction of mudbrick houses in Aswan to the rehabilitation of tuna fisheries in Sicily. Submission Information

Applicants are required to electronically submit a complete application no later than 6:00 p.m. (EST) on March 26, 2025. Complete applications include the Registration Form, Copyright Release Form, Verification Form, a research proposal, and a design portfolio.

Application Forms: Complete the Registration Form, Copyright Release Form, and Verification Form attached to this packet. The Verification Form must be signed by a department chair or school dean.

Research Proposal: Proposals must be submitted on a single-sided 11" × 17" sheet in landscape orientation; do not include your name or the name of your school. The proposal should feature an abstract of 350 to 500 words that covers the following points: the specific intent of the research, the motive or background of the project's origins, and the site(s) of research. Strong proposals will demonstrate prior knowledge of the research topic. Additionally, the proposal should include a title, itinerary, and budget. Applicants are encouraged to include images, maps, or other supporting graphics. Proposed travel should be a minimum of four weeks.

Design Portfolio: The design portfolio should stand in support of the proposal and supplement the applicant's profile. Strong design portfolios demonstrate an interest in the research proposal topic. The design portfolio should not exceed 10 single-sided pages and cannot include your name or the name of your school. Standard tabloid paper (11" × 17") is the maximum page size allowed. Do not include hyperlinks.

PDFs should be uploaded to: RAMSA Fellowship 2025. Digital files should be named "Fellowship_2025_School_ Last Name." Only fellowship administrators will have access to identifying information including filenames.

Robert A.M. Stern Architects, for any reason and at its sole discretion, reserves the right not to award the fellowship in any given year.

Terms of Fellowship

- Fellows are expected to complete their research and travel during the summer following the announcement of the award; if safe travel to the proposed location is not feasible in 2025, RAMSA will work with the fellow to determine an alternate timeline and/or proposal.
- Upon notice of the award, the fellow will receive \$12,500 and must submit a final travel itinerary.
 The finalist will receive \$1,500.
- Fellows are required to present their final research to RAMSA's office in New York City and submit a written report before a final check of \$2,500 is disbursed.
 RAMSA will cover the cost of travel and accommodation for the presentation.
- Fellows are encouraged to work with their school administration to present their research at their home institution.
- The fellow agrees to the use and publication by RAMSA of any part of the travel update(s), presentation, and final report in accordance with the terms of the Copyright Release Form; the fellow will be credited as the author of the work.
- A book based on the final reports of the 2023–27 fellows will be published in the fall of 2028. Fellows, jury members, and other RAMSA contributors will be appropriately credited.

Frequently Asked Questions

Q Who is eligible to apply?

A To be eligible to apply, you must be in the penultimate year of a graduate-level program in architecture or a related discipline at a NAAB-accredited school. PhD students are not eligible. You do not need to be a US citizen. Please contact us if you are unsure of your eligibility.

Q Is there a limit to the number of students who can apply from each school?

A No. All eligible students at a NAAB-accredited school may apply. A school dean or department chair must verify your enrollment by signing the Verification Form.

Q Are team applications accepted?

A No. At this time, the RAMSA Fellowship is only awarded to individual recipients.

Q Do I need to travel outside the United States?

A No. Depending on your research interests, you may travel within the United States. All regions and cultures of the world are potential topics for study.

What if travel is restricted or postponed due to safety concerns, such as COVID-19?

A If safe travel to the proposed location is not feasible in 2025, RAMSA will work with the fellow to determine an alternate timeline and/or proposal.

Q What is the residency program?

A The program provides fellows with a stipend to fund a two-week-long residency at RAMSA's office in New York City before or after their travel. During the residency, fellows develop their research project with the support of RAMSA staff and resources including our extensive architecture library. The residency is optional and in addition to the \$15,000 travel and research prize.

Why can't I have my name or the name of my school on the design portfolio or research proposal?

A Applications are reviewed anonymously by the fellowship jury. Therefore, any identifying information should be omitted. If your portfolio includes team projects, denote them as such without using names.

Q How are the proposals judged?

A jury of three RAMSA partners selects a winner and a finalist based on the clarity, feasibility, and originality of the proposals. Special attention will be given to how well the proposal aligns with the theme of the award: tradition through invention. Assume that the jurors have no prior knowledge of your research topic.

Q Can my abstract be over 500 words?

A No. A short, clear, and concise abstract will be most effective for conveying your ideas. Be sure to proofread thoroughly!

Q Should I include images?

A Absolutely! We strongly encourage applicants to include helpful images, maps, or other supporting graphics. Keep in mind that your audience is primarily architects.

What kind of work can I include in my design portfolio?

A The only work that cannot be included in your portfolio is work completed for an employer.
